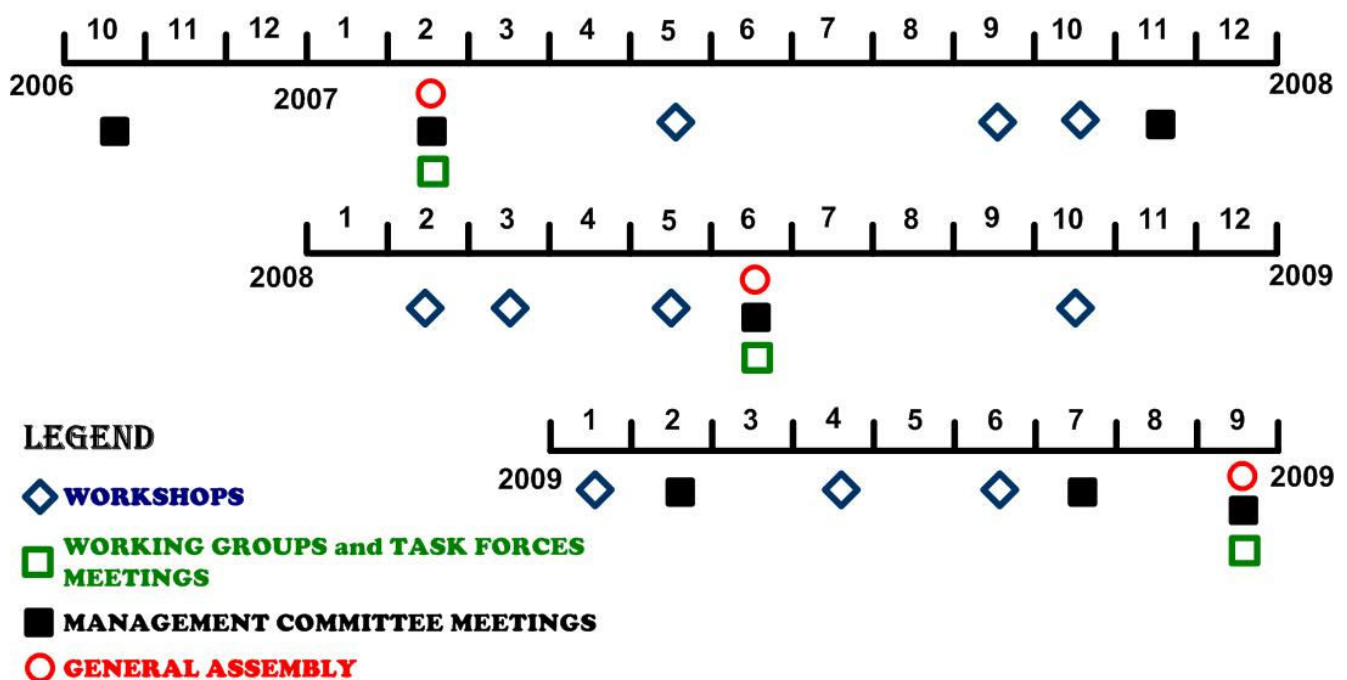

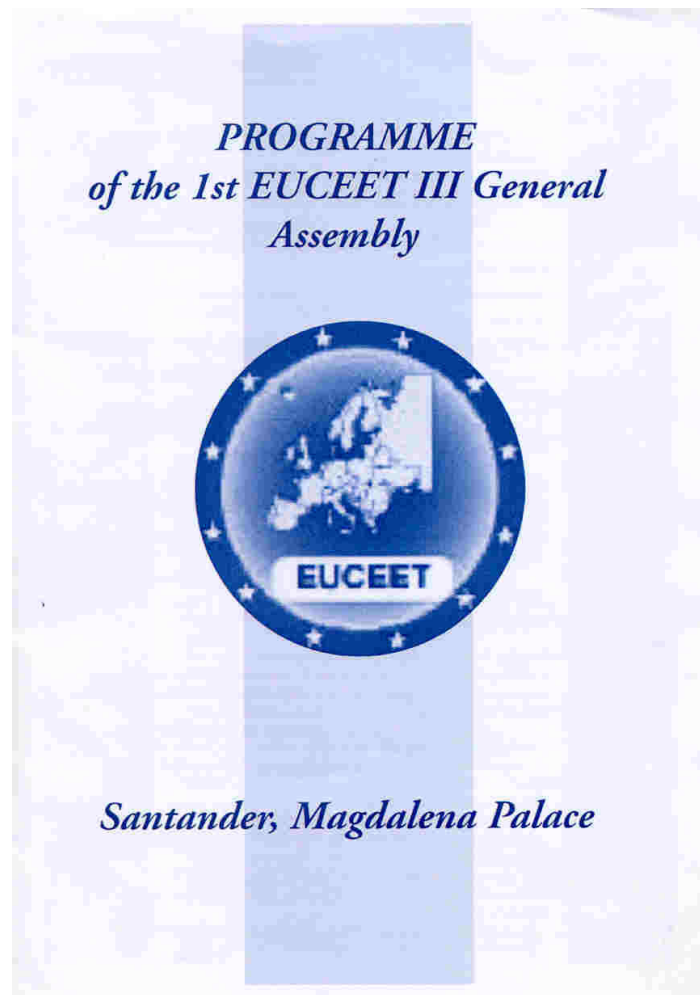

Year 0 and Year 1 of the EUCEET Association

According to the Belgium Law, the period from 16 March 2007 (the General Assembly in Santander) and 26 September 2008 (the General Assembly in Istanbul) is considered year 0.

Year 1 of the Association will start with the General Assembly in Istanbul where the new Administrative Council will be elected.

Fees will be collected beginning with the year 1, for an amount to be established at the GA in Istanbul.
